



# Holbury and Fawley Beat Report Sept 27 to Oct 10 – 2008

Hello and welcome to the latest beat report.

This has been a relatively quiet period with few incidents of note.

The few assaults have not been of a serious nature, however in three of the incidents in Fawley, the victims were all young men who were assaulted by strangers for no apparent reason. The victims didn't come from the local area but were able to give descriptions of their assailants and enquires are progressing.

Two people have been arrested for attempting to burgle a business premises in the parish. They are currently on police bail while further enquires are conducted but have been charged with other offences of theft in our area.

It is good to note that non-dwelling burglaries have fallen with only three reports, one of which led to the two men being arrested. In another nothing was taken and in the third, property belonging to the Parish Council was taken and enquires are ongoing. To ensure non dwelling burglaries reduce further, it is important that all suspicious behaviour is reported to police to be investigated, it is also essential that property and items are kept locked and secure. If you have sheds, garages etc please keep them locked with a solid heavy duty padlock to ensure that nothing can be taken or entry gained.

In Holbury there has been a number of anti-social incidents affecting shop keepers and customers. Some of those involved have also been attempting to steal from shops. In one incident someone was caught stealing and attempted to give police false details. This resulted in him being further arrested for obstructing the police and will be dealt separately. Holbury precinct has previously been an issue for anti-social behaviour and until recently has been relatively quiet. However due to the recent number of incidents reported, will now be subject to increased police patrols. We request the assistance of parents and peers of those who use this area anti-socially, to have words with the small number of youths who are involved and encourage them to behave as their conduct is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.

We work closely with partner agencies inc. the council, housing associations and schools. Where an individual is identified for
