



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report

October 25th to November 06 –2008

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

The main issue for the last fortnight remains the same as previous reports and that is the pattern of non dwelling burglaries to commercial premises overnight.

Police have increased patrolling to target the night time burglars and will be making extra resources available to deal with this current issue, if any person has knowledge of who the offenders are or if they see individuals or suspicious vehicles loitering in the area they should contact police immediately to report and make a good note of descriptions of offenders, their clothing as well as vehicle type colour and registration so that police can deal effectively.

There are also complaints in relation to individuals causing damage to vehicles and property late at night especially in the Fawley and Blackfield areas, police patrols are targeted to our area at the moment due to the burglaries and officers will be actively patrolling and dealing with all criminal behaviour encountered.

Thankfully the low level quality of life issues are low at the moment with Holbury especially being very peaceful with few incidents of inconsiderate or nuisance behaviour to note and those reported are of a very low level.

As a result of this improved behaviour in the neighbourhood the Hythe Safer Neighbourhood team have been able to divert resources towards directly targeting the active criminals in the Hythe and Fawley areas. This means that there has been an increase in the number of warrants for drugs and stolen goods which have been executed, which in turn has resulted in increased arrests of drug dealers in the Hythe policing area.

Though not part of the Fawley parish Hythe is nearby and the drug dealers from this area will and do sell their drugs to youths and residents from the Fawley area.

In the last week there have been 3 drug warrants executed on Netley view which has resulted in the arrest of 3 females on suspicion of supplying cannabis with considerable

Quantities of cannabis, cash and stolen or fake goods being seized.

At this moment in time the waterside area is not a good place to be for persons dealing drugs with police acting on all information received proactively

One individual from Netley has just been sentenced to 54 months in prison for possession of an ounce of cocaine with intent to supply and this was on an early guilty plea.

The vast majority of drug dealers are low level individuals who don't believe that they are doing any harm to themselves or the community. This is totally wrong as drugs affect all persons and any one who gets involved in drug dealing risks prison, eviction from their house if in social housing, drug users not paying for their deals and other dealers then using violence and intimidation to recover their money. There is nothing glamorous about this life style which will only lead to ruin.

To keep the tide running against the drug dealers in our area Inspector Leckey and the safer neighbourhood team urge any person who has information to call it into Hythe police station were they will be spoken to and the information taken in the strictest confidence.

With the financial times we are currently in there is often temptation to buy goods on the cheap ignoring the obvious to save a bit of money this is not a good idea as trading standards and police have noticed that there are currently a lot of fake items which are being offered for sale in the community as stolen and the genuine article. This is very unlikely to be the case and in one instance this week we have found jackets marked up as being worth £365 each and sold as stolen goods only for investigation to show that they are fake items as such the quality is likely to be poor and the price paid will be more than what the item is actually worth

This then puts the buyer in an awkward position as they can't report the matter to the police without implicating themselves, they end up out of pocket and the seller will not be looking to refund the money. Please ignore all offers to buy goods at supposedly knock down prices but instead pass this information on to the police and trading standards who will then investigate.

By using the businesses in our local community not only will you be able to guarantee the quality of the item, you will be supporting local jobs and if there are problems you will have a point of contact to speak to to get a refund.
