



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report November 8 – 21 2008

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

Mixed news I'm afraid this fortnight, firstly as can be seen by the figures opposite the number of incidents has increased for most crimes compared to previous reports.

However there have been a number of successes with criminals caught and arrested in our area.

The increase in crime can be attributed in the Fawley area in the main to mindless damage caused to gardens, cars and objects being thrown at windows.

It is particularly bad in the roads around and near the QE2 recreation ground. The incidents are occurring on all days of the week but are always during the hours of darkness. We have received reports of youths running away after being disturbed.

Police community support officer Bev Hayes is looking to set up a Neighbourhood Watch group in the area and anyone who wishes to take part or assist in this scheme is asked to contact PCSO Hayes at Hythe police station. Neighbourhood Watch is a very good scheme to reduce crime in an area and assist the police. It allows us to have local points of contact in the community which usually results in more informed calls to the police. Please if you do see anything suspicious or acts of criminality in progress then call 999 and remember to get a good description of the offender, their direction of travel and other vital pieces of information so that police can be called in to search the area effectively and quickly.

The burglaries in our area are still at unacceptably high levels with targeted premises in the main being commercial properties attacked overnight for cash, alcohol and cigarettes or unoccupied residential premises. Two of these dwelling burglaries took place in Blackfield, one in Fawley and one in Calshot. Three of the premises were unused but in one case the home owners were away on holiday and items of value were taken.

PCs Orr, Farley and other members of green shift at Hythe are pursuing promising leads in relation to the burglaries in the area.

PCs McClunna and Price have arrested an individual in the Holbury area for a number of offences including theft of metal, going equipped, possession of cannabis and growing cannabis after stop checking a suspicious vehicle in the area, enquires are still ongoing in this matter and the man will be returning on police bail early next year.

The Safer Neighbourhood team have been busy with assistance from the proactive and intelligence units at Lyndhurst, as a result warrants were executed at addresses in Fawley Holbury and Netley View against

individuals suspected of dealing drugs in our area. Evidence was seized and again enquires are still ongoing.

Also in Heather Road PC Rees, PC Hurrell and other officers including a dog unit arrested three men for theft from vehicles and public order offences. As a result of this two individuals were charged with one bailed pending further enquiries.

There have been a number vehicles seized recently in our area for no insurance and drivers either reported for summons to be dealt with by the court or given a fixed penalty notice of £200 and 6 points at the roadside. This is in addition to the cost of seizure and storage of the vehicles.

One individual was also arrested for drink driving and charged to go to court in the coming weeks with one other individual currently on bail on suspicion of driving while unfit through drugs. If you are going to drink then please don't drive but use a local taxi which will be cheaper in the long run and safer for everyone. There will be a crackdown on drink drivers in the very near future so please be warned and leave your car at home or nominate a designated driver.

Hopefully this newsletter shows that police are proactively targeting criminals and responding to reports of suspicious behaviour.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team will be looking to target more criminals in the coming months as and when information which can be acted on is received. Please do call us with information about any suspicious activity you see and if you know who is stealing, dealing or acting anti-socially then please let us know so we can target them. Unless you are prepared to attend court as a witness all this information will be treated as confidential and your identity protected.
