



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report Nov 22 to Dec 4 –2008

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

There have been a number of successes against criminals in the last fortnight in our area and though the crime figures are higher than would be liked in the Fawley and Blackfield area, offenders have been arrested.

In one case a burglary was reported in Fawley and as a result of enquires by local officers and PC Bradford of the Priority Crime Unit, two local youths were arrested and charged with the offence and another local theft matter. The victim of this crime attempted to make a fraudulent claim to their insurance company and as a result was charged with deception.

It is vital that people make honest reports to police as to do otherwise wastes police time and will be a crime in its own right, police are currently also looking at several other suspicious reports of incidents and any false reporting will be robustly dealt with.

In the Heather Road area there have been a number of unacceptable incidents of youths throwing paint around on cars and property as well as large groups of youths drinking alcohol and acting anti-socially. The offenders are not known and as such the local police appeal to anyone with information as to who they may be should contact us so that we can deal effectively with the situation and put individuals committing crime before the courts. In one case of anti-social behaviour a youth was arrested following public order offences and assaulting a police officer in Smith Close and has been charged to appear in the near future at youth court.

Police are patrolling and dealing with such individuals and a zero tolerance is being taken to such matters, PC Rees has recently arrested another youth in Heather Road for a public order offence and others will be arrested and dealt with were crimes are disclosed, warnings will not be given.

The Safer Neighbourhoods team at Hythe are currently targeting known criminals whether burglars or drug dealers and if any individual has information which they feel may help the police and make the community safer then they can contact us at Hythe police station at the number below in confidence if required.

There have been a number of incidents of nuisance behaviour in the Fawley area which include knocking on windows of elderly persons, kicking of fences as people walk past and shouting outside of houses late at night. PCSO Hayes would like to point out that though it may be considered to be a low level matter it can be intimidating to other residents, and requests that parents have a word with their children to explain that their behaviour though not necessarily criminal can and does cause distress to other members of the community and needs to be stopped.

PSCO Bev Hayes is currently doing a lot of work with neighbourhood watch and local beat surgeries.

On the January 6 between 7 and 8pm she will be at the community centre in Heather Road to deal with any issues regarding Neighbourhood Watch or community matters.

There have been a number of reports of vehicle nuisance again mainly in the Fawley area, as a result of these complaints there has been an arrest for drink driving and a vehicle seized Vehicle nuisance is a local priority as we receive numerous complaints on this matter, be it speeding, drivers on the phone, inconsiderate parking or cyclists disobeying the law.

We have concerns that there are a number of individuals who continue to ride cycles with no lights and in some cases with no brakes. Not only is this illegal, it is also putting lives at risk, there have been instances in the wider Hythe area where police patrols have encountered almost invisible individuals late at night cycling around. It goes without saying that individuals are dealt with for offences but in the interest of everyone Sgt Gillespie requests that with Christmas fast approaching to avoid a tragedy in the future, if you have cyclists in the family get them some lights and hi visibility clothing as a gift.
