



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report August 30 – September 12 2008

Welcome to this the slightly delayed Fawley parish beat update from Hythe Safer Neighbourhood team.

The area has seen a continued improvement in the already low levels of anti-social behaviour and nuisance issues as shown by the number of reports opposite.

Non dwelling burglaries are still an issue with four reports of attempted break-ins to businesses in this period.

As always we all need to be vigilant for suspicious behaviour and to report it immediately by dialling 999 if someone is still present, to ensure that patrols can attend as soon as possible.

In Holbury there was an increase in thefts and attempted thefts from motor vehicles, a local man has now been arrested in connection with these incidents and is currently on police bail to allow for further enquires. As with the burglaries it is vital that police are called when you have concerns about suspicious and out of character behaviour.

Neighbourhood Watch is a good way of combating and deterring criminal behaviour in your area. You can work together using crime prevention methods and greater vigilance in the area to protect your neighbours, the vulnerable and of course your own property.

Police have been putting increased patrols in the area and are targeting known criminals believed to be involved in theft and burglary offences, as a result four people were arrested recently in connection with these incidents.

As part of this increased police activity two people were stopped and have been stop checked and searched at Calshot beach where there have been recent burglaries. This stop check resulted in two cautions for possession of cannabis and one driver being investigated for insurance offences.

The number uninsured vehicles which have been seized in our area has also gone up recently due to targeting hot spots and increased patrolling, as shown in the road incidents above.

There have been a number of assaults in our area, these were in the main of a minor nature and didn't result in injuries.
