### SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS

**Firstly a very Happy New Year** to you all. By the number of crimes reported to the police over the festive period, it appears that the residents of the Fawley community had a very safe and peaceful Christmas and start to the New Year.

**To start with some good news** regarding the damage to beach huts and property in the Calshot area last year. Luke Franklin a 21-year-old man from the area has been given an Antisocial Behaviour Order, (ASBO), with the following conditions.

- 1) Not to behave in a manner which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to any person not of the same household.
- 2) Not to use abusive, offensive or threatening words that would cause or are likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to persons not of the same household.
- 3) Not to damage deface or foul property belonging to others or buildings or public areas or parts of thereof.
- 4) Not to enter the area of Calshot beach south of the start of the one way system.
- 5) Not to enter Fawley power station.
- 6) Not to associate with Daniel Cooper, Terence

James or Michael White. Mr Luke Franklin can be arrested for any breach of these conditions.

It is hoped the quality of life for residents and visitors to Calshot beach will be improved by this court order.

**There have been several walls** in the area damaged. Residents who have had their walls damaged may get a cold call to their door a few days later by someone offering to repair the damage.

Police would advise residents to only receive repairs by reputable trade's people who have business addresses and can provide examples of work carried out. Currently police are investigating whether these walls are being deliberately damaged and anyone with information is advised to contact us.

**Police were on duty** as usual over the Christmas period and this resulted in a number of arrests for breach of court orders, failing to appear at court and wanted offenders.

**Two youths** were arrested on Christmas Eve and one was charged with three offences.

**Have you committed offences** and wish to make a fresh start, then please contact your local police station.

Police and the courts operate a system whereby if an offender admits their wrong doings, these offences can be taken into consideration when passing sentence.

The benefit of this is that offenders may not have to attend court if they plead guilty and their sentence may be reduced.

Rest assured that police are always gathering evidence from a number of sources to convict those offenders who do not report themselves.

## SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS

Below is a guide to help residents understand how the police record crime.

**Rowdy and inconsiderate:** This is any behaviour which isn't a crime but reduces the quality of life for residents that can be inappropriate for an area.

**Dwelling burglary** is where a person(s) has entered a house or part of a building that someone lives in and has gone on to steal or cause damage.

**Non dwelling burglary** This includes non-residential buildings entered by trespass where theft or damage has occurred or been attempted. These buildings are usually sheds or garages of residential buildings which are not attached to them or offices and industrial or commercial buildings.

**Theft** is any dishonestly taken property and includes theft from houses, theft of cycles, shoplifting and theft from open land (gardens fields etc).

**Robbery** This is where a person threatens or uses force towards another person before or during a theft.

**Damage** is the destruction or harm of property and includes graffiti and arson (damage by fire). Damage does not have to be permanent and includes temporary damage that can

be repaired or cleaned up soon afterwards.

**Vehicle Crime** this includes theft of a vehicle, theft from a vehicles and damage to a vehicle.

**Disputes** are any arguments where no offences are committed and usually involve family or friends; a dispute does not include assaults, public order or damage. Disputes can include civil arguments over money or property, where there was police involvement to prevent a breach of the peace.

**Road policing incidents (formally vehicle nuisance)** includes drink driving, disqualified driving, speeding and reports of vehicles causing nuisance and finally vehicles seized for not having insurance. This category does not include road accidents.

**Public order**, is threatening, abusive or disorderly behaviour that mainly occurs in a public place and causes harassment alarm or distress to another person.

**Assault** is any unlawful use of force no matter how minor to sexual assaults and murder.

**Drugs** include possession of any drug which is unlawfully possessed irrespective of whether it is for personal use or for supply to others.

**Other Crime** includes selling of alcohol to persons under 18 years, breach of community orders and other matters not covered by the above
