SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS

Hello

Welcome to this parish bulletin from the Fawley Parish Safer Neighbourhoods team. There are no serious crimes to report and in the main crime is on a downward trend.

There have been no burglaries to residential properties in this period and no assaults at all reported to police for Holbury. The six reported assaults in Fawley and Blackfield were mainly of a minor nature involving school children.

However in one domestic incident where minor injuries were sustained, the offender was given a four month detention order by the court after being remanded by the police. Police, CPS and the courts take domestic abuse very seriously as shown in this case.

If any person is suffering from domestic abuse or knows of someone who is and needs assistance, the domestic abuse unit for this area can offer support and advice. In addition to the actions of local police in dealing with any complaint, Hampshire Constabulary's policy on this matter is to take positive action to arrest the suspect, investigate the offence and support the victim while bringing the offender to justice.

In Holbury there has been a spate of damage to motor vehicles and property, especially in the Southbourne Avenue area. PC COUCH is aware of this as are other officers and extra resources are being put in place to reduce crime in this area and to identify and arrest offenders.

In Calshot Luke Franklin who is currently on an ASBO and a 9-month, suspended sentence for offences in the area has been reported by probation services for breaching the terms of his suspended sentence. As a result Franklin will be returning

to court in the next fortnight for this matter to be dealt with.

PCSO's Spooner and Hayes are currently working with the parish council in order to promote youth work and are looking at the possibility of arranging a community event at Gangwarily in the coming months. Both officers are keen to deal with groups from the community especially involving youths, or older people and can be contacted at Hythe police station for matters relating to neighbourhood watch, crime prevention and community issues.

PC Tilbury has been dealing with the increase in animal deaths and accidents on Forest roads and as a result Safer Neighbourhoods officers together with the community road policing unit undertook speed enforcement on the B3054, which has the highest number of animal casualties in our area, which statistically occur in the late afternoon to early evening period. This initiative involved the use of a high visibility large police vehicle, and all police officers wearing reflective yellow jackets on the roadside.

The result of the operation was that 12 people were given fixed penalty notices for exceeding the 40 mph limit (range of speeds 50-60). 11 of the offending motorists were local people with four coming from the Fawley parish.

Only two of the motorists were youths with the other 10 being aged between 40 and 57.

This is very disappointing in that other motorists were signalling the presence of the police to oncoming cars and the high visibility nature of the operation.

Clearly if motorists fail to notice this then they are not likely to see horses on the road at low light times.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team will continue to put in place measures to reduce animal casualties on our roads and to promote road safety.
