



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report January 31 – February 13 2009

It is nice to see that reports are still at a low level with no dwelling burglaries reported and only three assaults, most of which are domestic incidents. None resulted in serious injury.

In the Blackfield area there were two non-dwelling burglaries to sheds, one where a tool bag was stolen. In the second entry was attempted but nothing taken. One of these attempts was on the property of an elderly lady. PCSO Bev Hayes would urge you to keep an eye on vulnerable neighbours who may appreciate the extra reassurance.

In the Holbury area there were two burglaries to commercial premises where flowers and cards were taken which were likely for selling on in relation to Valentines Day and Mothers Day. If anyone has been offered such items for sale in a pub or by someone attending your front door then please let us know at Hythe police station.

Red shift and green shift located a man in the Fawley area and on arresting him found a large amount of cash, and substances likely to be Class A drugs, the man is currently on police bail to allow for further enquires.

PCSOs Hayes and Gordon detained three people after smelling cannabis in the Gangwarily sports grounds. These individuals have been dealt with by means of youth warnings and one individual going to court for possession of cannabis.

There was just one report of damage to property in the last fortnight which was a brick thrown through a window of a house in the Holbury area, enquires are continuing in respect to this offence.

After a report from the Fawley Youth Worker regarding a youth riding a quad bike around Heather Road and Gangwarily in a dangerous manner during the period of icy/snowy weather, a youth was detained by police.

On investigation the youth was found to have no licence or insurance and has been dealt with by means of a £200 fine and six points to be put on his provisional licence which will affect his future insurance premiums.

It is worth mentioning to parents that mini quad bikes, scramblers and mini motos are motor vehicles for the purposes of the law and will need insurance and a driving licence if driven on a the road or in a public place.

The only safe place to use these is on private land with permission and the proper safety clothing. It is not acceptable to allow your children to possess such vehicles and allow them to use them on public roads so that they can amuse themselves away from the home. This results in nuisance and anti-social behaviour for other residents and road users and could potentially result in serious injury or death to your child, especially since some of the bikes which have been seized by police recently have not been maintained and have been in a less than safe condition.

There have been three vehicles damaged in the Fawley area with cars having tyres slashed in the Tristan Close and Blackfield areas.

There was one report of fly tipping on Calshot beach and a person burning rubbish on a bonfire for which the fire service attended and took down details of the offending vehicle which they passed on to police and the local council. As a result a man attended Hythe police station and accepted a fixed penalty ticket for this matter.

PCSO HAYES and I are still finding youths aged under 16 openly smoking tobacco in the street, which has been given to them by friends and parents. This may be acceptable in the home however police have a duty in law to seize tobacco from anyone under 16 years of age. Bearing in mind the cost of tobacco and the health implications for youths it should not be available until they are old enough to buy it themselves.

Finally, there are still individuals drink-driving as shown by the increase in arrests over the Christmas period. Police are still cracking down on drink driving and one man has arrested and charged in the Holbury area for this offence.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team are always looking for intelligence from the local community so we can continue to put the criminals among us under pressure.
