



# Holbury and Fawley Beat Report March – 2009

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

There is some very good news regarding dwelling burglaries in our area, (though outside the fortnight of this report). Three youths have been arrested and interviewed. Two admitted committing 21 burglaries in Fawley, Blackfield and Totton, while the other admitted to one burglary and one of handling stolen goods.

The two youths who admitted the spate of burglaries have now been remanded into youth custody by Magistrates while the third is on court bail. It is hoped that the number of dwelling burglaries will now drop.

There has been a slight increase in rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour, especially in Holbury where a number of complaints about youths playing football, drinking alcohol and trespassing on school grounds or private property. The majority of these are not criminal and PC Alison Tilbury and PCSO Dan Gordon have been patrolling this area and will continue to do so to monitor the situation.

The QE2 sports ground in Fawley is starting to raise some concerns about underage drinking, although the majority of youths who congregate here are well behaved and a credit to themselves and their families.

It is though not uncommon to find large quantities of empty alcohol bottles and cans, or to hear about boys and girls urinating in public on the playing fields. This is totally unacceptable behaviour.

Parents have an important part to play in ensuring their children behave sensibly and appropriately when they leave the family home. Parents should challenge underage drinking and if necessary, consider imposing sanctions to prevent their child being brought to the attention of the police through their conduct and behaviour/

We do not wish to be kill joys or prevent youngsters' from enjoying themselves, but equally it is not our responsibility to act as their parents or

guardians either. Let's remind ourselves of the potential consequences of underage drinking that led to the tragic death of Merchant Seaman, Gregory Fernandes in Fawley last year. This resulted in local youths receiving custodial sentences for their involvement that led to his death.

There have been a few assaults in the Fawley area with one person who has been involved in Class A drugs being subject to two quite serious assaults. These are being investigated by Lyndhurst CID.

Other assaults were of a minor nature with a number of individuals arrested and dealt with for their actions.
