



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report March 28 – April 10 2009

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

There has been some very good news in relation to dwelling burglaries in our area as reported in the last newsletter. Although there are still a high number of burglaries in this report it is good to see that in quite a few of them, especially the house burglaries, suspects have been arrested and admitted the offences and are currently on remand.

There have been a number of burglaries to commercial premises especially in the Hampton Lane area where individuals late at night have targeted shops and garages and got away with cash and property.

As a result of police investigations into similar burglaries in the Hythe area a vehicle linked to Blackfield was identified and the address of the owner searched under warrant and a large quantity of what are believed to be class A and B drugs seized. The investigation is ongoing.

In Calshot there has been yet another attack on beach huts over night with four huts damaged by arson (two totally destroyed), one hut attempted to be set a light and a further hut attacked and damage caused to the structure. Police are very keen to speak to any fishermen or visitors to Calshot Beach who were present overnight April 3/4 and saw anything suspicious.

There have also been a considerable number of vehicles damaged not just in the Fawley Parish area but in Hythe too. These attacks have been in the early hours of the morning on the last two weekends. The attacks appear to be random with nothing suspicious to location or victim. To catch these criminals local police are diverting officers and resources to see if extra patrols can deal with the matter and PC COUCH the Dibden Purlieu Beat officer is currently working on this spate of crimes. He is appealing to anyone with knowledge to contact him either in person or by leaving a message which can be done anonymously.

It is good to see that there have been no incidents of assault of reported in the Holbury area in the last fortnight with only being four assaults being reported for the Fawley area, two of which are historic reports from February.

In relation to drugs police are targeting our known dealers and locations where drugs are regularly taken. As a result a man from the Fawley area has been arrested by Lyndhurst CID for drugs supply

At Calshot beach PCs Hurrell and Barrow were suspicious of a car parked up in the car park area and on searching the vehicle came across cannabis which resulted in the driver being dealt with for this offence.

In Holbury one man made a false report of theft naming a third party as having stolen his cycle, this resulted in needless police enquiries and as a result the male was given an £80 fixed penalty ticket for wasting police time.

While patrolling in the Fawley area PC Rees stopped a vehicle which had been taken without the owners consent. As a result the vehicle has been returned to the owner and the driver has been charged with taking a vehicle without consent.
