



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report April 11 – April 24 2009

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

There has been a very noticeable drop in burglaries and other reports of crimes in the last fortnight, and this may well be due to the current detention of some of our local burglars.

There has been one incident of note in the Holbury area. Overnight on April 17, two horse racing buggies and mechanical tools were stolen from a yard and a vehicle was set a light and burnt out. If anyone has any knowledge as to who was involved please contact Hythe police station to make a statement or speak in confidence

If you are offered a cheap racing buggy or tools which you know or believe to be stolen, then please don't be tempted to buy, as this is in itself a crime which can be more serious than the original theft. In the Holbury area a man has been charged with handling stolen goods taken from a local address and will be appearing in court for this matter.

In Blackfield a man has been dealt with in connection with a number of shopliftings from Tescos in Blackfield. He received a fixed penalty notice, was banned from the store and is having to repay the goods stolen.

In Calshot there have been two burglaries to beach huts with items being taken and police are following up on leads to these offences.

We are still suffering from too many incidents of criminal damage and though the numbers have dropped recently they are still too high. The Fawley Methodist Church has been attacked three times in the last fortnight with damage caused to windows. This is unacceptable and patrols in the area have been increased with myself and other officers targeting hot spot areas in plain clothes, anyone found committing offences can expect to be arrested and spend time in cells while evidence is gathered.

On the matter of air rifles it is very important that if people are going to use them in their own gardens for target practice they don't allow for the pellets to travel into neighbouring gardens, this is an offence which may be prosecuted and can result in the seizure of the air weapon.

PC Alison Tilbury has just dealt with two individuals from the Heather Road area who were caught poaching pheasants in the Beaulieu area, which has resulted in the air rifle being seized and two men being reported to court for the offence.
