



# Holbury and Fawley Beat Report June – 2009

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish beat report.

It is nice to see that reported crime is at low levels with no serious assaults, and those assaults reported being of a minor nature. If the police do have evidence and it is in the public interest then offenders will be dealt with even if the attacked person doesn't make an official complaint. The reason police deal robustly with all incidents of violence is to deter and prevent more serious attacks and to protect the public in general.

The main reports to police in the last fortnight have been for rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour, which appears to mainly be concerned with underage drinking at the weekends. Recently we had reports of large groups of youths acting anti socially in the Blackfield area close to the QE 2 Recreation park, and a report of criminal damage to a fence nearby. Patrols of the area have reduced this problem and an investigation into the damage is ongoing.

Some of our anti social behaviour reports can be attributed to youngsters out and about in the evenings or at the weekends, but some are also down to adults. Over the summer months the Safer Neighbourhood team will be dealing robustly with nuisance issues that are affecting the wider community. so please work with us and Please ensure that you respect your neighbours and fellow residents, and that you know where your children are going, and that they have to be back home at a time which is appropriate for their age.

Hopefully this will prevent property damage, keep people safe and enable everyone to enjoy themselves. It is important to remember that we all have the right to go out and enjoy ourselves, but we must all respect each other.

On some occasions we do get complaints where youths are playing football or running around in areas which are set aside for this purpose; we will not move on or victimise youths who are acting appropriately for the location and time of day.

In Holbury two vehicles were taken with one boat and trailer also stolen. Both vehicles were stopped by police with the drivers being prosecuted for taking without consent.

As with the past beat report there is still a problem with dogs which are not under control, on Heather Road one dog recently escaped and attacked another dog. Both animals required treatment at the vets, and one person received minor injuries trying to separate the dogs. All dogs should be properly secured and on a lead where appropriate.

PC Tilbury has been dealing with racing motor cars in Holbury and across the New Forest. Unfortunately there has been an increase in pony crashes, with many foals which have just left their mothers' side and are not used to the road being knocked down and killed. Some drivers do not report these incidents - this is an offence and any person who is involved in a road accident with free roaming forest animals and doesn't report it can expect to be prosecuted with several motorists already dealt with this year . Please keep to the speed limits; in the New Forest animals have right of way and will stray into the road without warning.
