Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter. Apologies for the delay in the previous newsletters which have been due to my being away.

As such the last two reports only consist of the table of reported incident.

It is nice to see that in the last 6 weeks crime has been at a low level with there being only 2 dwelling burglaries and 6 non dwelling burglaries with some of these being attempts only with no who is responsible so that the matter can be dealt with and justice done.

Assaults in the main have been low level incidents these incidents require a serious drain on fire service resources and whilst our local retained fire fighters are dealing with grass fires they are not deployable to other incidents were life may be at risk damage and vehicle crime are still issues especially late at night over the weekend periods with the area has been working closely with the police and the apparatus task force in order to target problem youths and put in place initiatives to reduce fire starting especially in our National Park area this and other areas to reduce crime and anti social behaviour, and have been seizing anti social driving inconsiderate parking and speeding are some of the most frequently raised issues by local residents.

Due to these complaints the local Road Policing Unit have monitored the B3053 especially the 40 mph limit as it passes Fawley Village and found that it meets the ACPO criteria for speed enforcement due to the number of motorists who exceed the speed limit. So please keep this in mind when travelling on local roads to avoid a fine and penalty points.
