We fully support the youngsters enjoying themselves during their time off schools, however this kind of activity can be annoying and distressing for other residents, and if children need to let off steam then the best places for this are local play parks.

PCSO's Bev Hayes, Ollie Hulse and Andy Spooner have been busy setting up the 'Young PCSO' scheme for Heather Road, which was officially launched in Monday, August 17. This project is aimed at diverting children away from nuisance behaviour and educating them about subjects such as road safety, community issues, and taking pride in their local area, which began with a litter pick on the launch day. The first meeting for those involved in the scheme will be on Monday, September 14 at the Sure Start centre Heather Road.



The age range for young PCSOs is from 5 to 14 years, and we already have 15 children who will be involved. This project has been very successful elsewhere in Hampshire and the children really enjoy getting to know more about community policing, their local officers, and safety issues. If any parent is interested in discussing this program then please contact one of the PCSOs at Hythe police station to find out more information and how your child can get involved.

Reported crime in the Holbury and Fawley areas is still very low, with no dwelling burglaries reported, and most assaults being of a minor nature. We are continuing to deal robustly with any offenders, including one man from Holbury who was recently charged with assault and will appear in court.

Offences involving the internet are all too easy to fall victim to, and several people in the area have recently sent money to scams, which are often sound genuine, but they haven't received what they paid money for. These organisations can be from anywhere in the UK or abroad and rely on the goodwill and trust of others.

Please take care when using the internet and don't send money to people you don't know. If you are in any doubt contact the police or trading standards before parting with money, as all too often it is impossible to recover losses on out-of-country fraud.
