



Holbury and Fawley Beat Report September 12 to 25 –2009

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish newsletter.

Apologies for the delay in getting this report out however due to the unacceptably high number of anti social incidents in the Holbury area local officers have been putting all available time into patrolling and targeting potential trouble makers and investigating crimes in this area.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team is noticing that the number of youths walking around the streets in groups during the evening and late at night is increasing with Holbury Precinct, Long Lane and adjoining roads particularly experiencing problems. With high reports of rowdy behaviour, criminal damage and other street crime.

PC Alison Tilbury has targeted and interviewed a youth believed to be involved, for damage and public order offences which are currently being investigated. This youth has also been detained prevent a breach of the peace by PC Gavin Couch and returned to his parents.

Patrols have been increased in the Holbury area at problem times with a zero tolerance approach being taken to offences being committed and officers stopping and speaking to groups of youths. It is important to state that it is only a small number of individuals who are causing the problems and that often the people who are affected the most by their anti social behaviour are other decent law abiding youths who are intimidated, bullied and prevented from socialising freely in the area in which they live.

In the Fawley area, particularly around Heather road, there has been an increase in incidents of rowdy behaviour with individuals shouting swearing and damaging street furniture late at night, often while in drink after pub closing hours.

In Langley there have been quite a number of complaints in relation to noisy groups. As a result passing attention has been paid to this area in particular around Lepe Road and West Common with police also monitoring local public houses to ensure that they comply with their responsibilities.

In the rural area of the parish especially on and around Lepe and Stanswood Road it has been noticed that some individuals are driving anti socially late at night with excess noise and speed, this is a serious issue and will be targeted with offenders potentially having their vehicles seized.

Another area of concern is the continued lighting of grass fires in hedges and heath land. These can have serious and devastating consequences to life, if the fires get out of control and cause injury.



It is vital that any person who has evidence as to fire starting no matter how small contact the police and discuss what they know which can be in confidence if necessary. I can be contacted on 101 at Hythe police station.
