Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter.

It has been noticed that though anti social behaviour is still too high especially in the Holbury precinct area, incidents are reducing in number and individuals who have/are being monitored by us are changing their behaviour.

One youth in Holbury has been arrested and charged by PC Jordon-McGill for causing damage to fencing and plants after being involved in a street fight with other youths.

All four incidents of assaults occurred in or around Holbury Precinct and didn't involve serious injury, individuals have been arrested in connection with this and PC Phil Price is investigating.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods officers have been actively patrolling conducting targeted patrols to stop check potential trouble makers and this will continue as long as required.

PCSO Andy Spooner is working with Colours youth club at Hardley to ensure that the decent majority of youths have a point of contact to discuss any problems or issues they may have.

Chief Inspector Gary Cooper has put a lot of effort into rural policing initiatives in the wider New Forest and as a result of his efforts PCSO Bev Hayes and I have been able to put in patrols in the Calshot beach area where we have

provided a high number of beach hut owners with state of the art “Smart Water” kits to protect their property. Each Smart Water kit is unique and leaves a trace on any individual who comes into contact with.

Hampshire police custody centres are now equipped with special equipment which can detect smart water. As such, if an individual was to commit a crime or handle stolen goods where smart water is present they can be positively linked to the offence and can expect to be charged with any offences disclosed.



Recently three individuals from the local area have been charged with burglary to beach huts at Calshot back in April of this year in a case investigated by PC Jordon-McGill.

A number of uninsured drivers in the Fawley area have recently been targeted by the road policing proactive unit, with several vehicles being seized and drivers being issued with fixed penalty notices and points. These drivers and others who fail to insure their vehicles will continue to be targeted.

Police are continuing to target drug dealers in our area and there have been several incidents recently where youths from Fawley have been found in possession of drugs and are being dealt with for these offences.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team will be looking to robustly target any individuals who chose to deal drugs and ask that if anyone in the community has information which can assist us they contact me or another officer at Hythe police station in confidence so their concerns can be acted on.
