



# Holbury and Fawley Beat Report October 9 - October 23 2009

Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter.

As can be seen rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour is the main problem in the Fawley Parish at this moment in time with groups of teenage youths congregating around shops and causing nuisance to shop owners and customers by their loud noise, horse play and blocking of doorways. Though not necessarily criminal this behaviour is totally inappropriate for the area and the right place for it is in parks and play areas.

Parents have a responsibility for their children's actions and those who overstep the line will continue to receive visits or letters from the police. If their child commits offences parents are required to attend the police station to act as an appropriate adult, which may mean having to take time off work or missing out on time at home or socialising.

A lot of the youths we meet when patrolling the streets are often in possession of cycles which have no brakes or lights with no reflective or protective clothing. Obviously this can put their safety at risk if they are not visible to motor vehicles or in a position to stop in an emergency. With dark nights now upon us it may well be that these items could be brought as early Christmas presents.

Though assaults are small in number and in the main minor in nature police do continue to take a zero tolerance approach to violence, arresting

any individual who carries out such acts. Unfortunately in one incident where a man was assaulting his partner in the street, two officers were assaulted with one receiving injuries requiring hospital treatment.

There have been no burglaries to houses in our parish in the last fortnight but there was one non dwelling burglary in the Holbury area where three ferrets were stolen from an outbuilding overnight on October 17. If anyone has knowledge of this incident or is aware of friends or neighbours recently obtaining such animals in suspicious circumstances then please contact Hythe police station so the matter can be investigated and the ferrets returned to their owner.

In the Heather road area there have been a couple of public order incidents. One in Heather road has resulted in an arrest and is being investigated by PC Jordan-McGill, in the other a middle aged man has been reported for summons for using abusive language to primary school aged children so that matter can be dealt at court.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team has been putting in extra patrols in the parish recently to target anti social and disorderly behaviour and will continue to take a robust response to anyone committing offences.

Unfortunately we are still having a number of fires started in our area which are in the main on heath land; however in one incident in Hedley Close, Fawley a Ford Ka was deliberately set a light in the earlier hours of October 20. If anyone has knowledge of the offender then please let me know so I can deal with the matter.

Finally a man from Blackfield was caught driving while disqualified in Southampton, with local police actively targeting illegal use of motor vehicles.
