



# Holbury and Fawley Beat Report October 23 – November 6 2009

## Welcome to the Fawley Parish Newsletter.

Rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour has fallen quite considerably over the last fortnight, which is quite an achievement bearing in mind that Halloween and bonfire night are part of this report. We are also pleased to tell you that during this period there have been no dwelling burglaries.

Overnight on October 28, a number of allotments, beach huts and other premises were vandalised. Padlocks were broken off but there was no attempt to gain entry or steal items. If anyone has any knowledge of who has stolen a high number of padlocks, not just in the Fawley area but in Hythe too, then please contact Hythe police station.

We have increased our patrols in the Fawley Parish area and as a result, Sergeant Packer and his team have arrested five people in connection with ongoing criminal damage and anti-social behaviour incidents in the Holbury area.

In Fawley a man was arrested for criminal damage when he broke a pub window after being asked to leave due to his behaviour. He will be banned from all the pubs in the Waterside area, through the Pub Watch scheme.

There have been a few minor incidents of assault reported to police. However, these have mostly been low level assaults and the aggrieved have not required hospital treatment. That being said, just because an incident does not lead to injury, police can and do arrest offenders.

On November 2 at around 6pm a woman was robbed in Hampton Lane, which police are currently investigating. Please call DC Poole at Lyndhurst CID on **101** if you have any information about this incident which could help us with our inquiries.

A warrant was executed at an address In Heather Road and a man was detained for possession of an illegal substance.
