Welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter.

As can be seen from the table, crime overall is at a very low level in our area; especially when compared to other parts of Hampshire or the UK.

Burglaries

However, unfortunately we have had a spate of dwelling burglaries in the Blackfield area over the last few weeks. Most of these have been centred around Hampton Lane, where person/s unknown have been looking for points of weakness in order to try and force entry. Not all burglaries have been successful however and in some instances entry has been gained but no property has been stolen.

In the Holbury area, there have been four non-dwelling burglaries recently. Clearly we have active burglars in our area and so we have been focusing our patrols and putting out officers in plain clothes to target the areas being affected. We have also been running stop checks on individuals in the area acting suspiciously.

If any person sees suspicious behaviour it is important to report it to us immediately, so that the information can be acted upon. Please try and note as much information as possible, including descriptions of the person, their clothing and their vehicle and also their direction of travel if they have left the scene. This will allow officers attending to

However, police take a common sense approach to all reports and, where appropriate, will deal with these incidents by offering strong words of advice, rather than criminalise individuals for low level matters. However, any abusive behaviour in a public domain can result in the offender receiving a criminal record or a fixed penalty ticket. It is never a good idea to put private thoughts or empty words of anger into the public domain so please think before you type or text!

Motoring offences

In Blackfield, a local driver had his vehicle seized outside one of the local primary schools. In Holbury, officers seized a Porsche Boxster after the driver was found to be uninsured.

Plain sailing

Hampshire Constabulary Marine Unit kindly attended a local sailing club to assist in marking boats, outboards and other items of value to make them more difficult to steal and sell on. They also gave a presentation on crime prevention and reporting suspicious incidents in the Solent area.
