Welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter.

The last fortnight has been shown a considerable drop in crime and anti social behaviour, Police have taken action towards individuals who have or might be causing problems in the area.

We have made arrests in connection with a spate of recent burglaries. Since November 27 there have been no burglaries in the Blackfield area.

Police are continuing to use various tactics to disrupt and prevent criminal activity including plain clothes patrols on foot and in vehicles, targeting areas where incidents have been occurring and targeting people linked to crime.

These measures aren't just aimed at those committing serious crimes like burglaries but also at groups who are acting anti-socially. As a result PC Hendy and PC Couch from the Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team have assisted in patrolling our area.

Police have also been targeting drink drivers and those individuals without driving licences or insurance, with one lady from Calshot being arrested for drink driving and another lady from Hythe being caught without a driving licence.

Another lady from Fawley who failed to attend court for her driving offences has now had a warrant issued for her arrest and arrangements have been made on this matter to put her before the court.

Hampshire Constabulary currently have several initiatives to deal with alcohol related offences be it drink driving, underage sales or late night public order by drunks.

Hythe Safer Neighbourhoods team and our Roads Policing Unit will be putting in extra patrols in the run up to Christmas and New Year so please bear this in mind, if you are going to drink out then don't drive, plan ahead and either book one of our local taxis to take you home or get together with a group of friends and have a nominated driver on soft drinks. It is not worth for the sake of a taxi fare risking your life, someone else's, your job, driving licence and your family's security by drink driving.

Hampshire Constabulary has launched a campaign in the run up to Christmas and New Year to tackle drink and drug driving. Text 80 999 to report to us someone you think is driving under the influence of drink or drugs.

It also goes without saying that if you are found drunk in public causing a nuisance then you will be dealt with robustly too.

Finally if you have valuables don't leave them on show, make notes of the serial numbers and security mark them. Criminals are in the main opportunists and good security will reduce your chances of being a victim of crime.
