Welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter.

We start the year with a new Sergeant leading our team. We would like to welcome Sergeant Simon Flint, who has moved over from custody to join us. After four years at Hythe, Sergeant Kevin Gillespie has gone to work in custody.



Crime in the parish is still at a very low level compared to other areas in the county and lots of information about offenders has been coming in, which has greatly assisted our investigations.

Assault

There was a serious assault on a man at the Langley Tavern on Lepe Rd. Lyndhurst CID are currently dealing with this crime and have requested that anybody who witnessed the incident or has information which could assist them with their enquiries please call them on [101](tel:101).

Other assaults have thankfully not resulted in injuries and the offenders have been arrested and matters investigated where appropriate.

Offences involving motor vehicles

In Holbury, two people were arrested for drink driving by our local Roads Policing Unit. It is disappointing to see that some people take risks and drive whilst under the influence of alcohol. Sergeant Lamb and his Roads Policing Unit will be targeting the Fawley area in the coming months and will be dealing robustly with any offenders. This will be a ongoing campaign

with marked and unmarked cars. There is no excuse for breaking traffic laws. In both incidents all the offenders have been dealt with and either fixed penalty notices, cautions or final warnings were issued.

New Heather Road Initiative

Sergeant Barry from the Safer Streets team has been working hard to put together an initiative called 'Brand New Heather Road.' Police and other agencies will be looking to improve the quality of life for all residents and deal robustly with anti-social behaviour and anyone committing crime in the area.



Finally, with the recent bout of adverse weather it is vital that drivers prepare their vehicles and themselves. This means checking the vehicle before driving to ensure it is road worthy (anti freeze, tyre pressures and tread depth, high strength screen wash), and keeping a survival kit in the car (blanket, food, thermos and a charged mobile phone.) Finally, please assess whether the journey is necessary and whether the road is safe to drive. There is no point setting off on a journey you will not be able to finish. Forest roads can be treacherous and you will need to reduce your speed to account for the conditions.
