Hello and welcome to the latest Fawley Parish Newsletter.

Reports of crime are still low in the Fawley Parish area which is encouraging. We are also pleased to report that there have been a number of successful detections recently, with offenders being dealt with by police or put before the courts.

Damage incidents in Holbury

There have been several criminal damage incidents across the Holbury area in the last fortnight. Seven vehicles have been damaged or broken into and four properties have been damaged with their fences and windows being broken.

There have also been two incidents where individuals have entered buildings but not stolen anything. Scenes of crime officers do attend these incidents and forensic evidence is regularly obtained to help identify the offenders.

Police are continuing to patrol this area at night to deal with these reports and if anyone has any information or has seen anyone acting suspiciously they are asked to contact the police on **101** or report it anonymously to CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111. Always dial **999** if an incident is in progress.

Assault

All reported assaults have been dealt with appropriately. Two people have been charged with assault and a third has been given a final warning.

You would never trust a stranger in the street with your property and the same applies with personal requests by phone, letter or email. Always be conscious of scams and keep sensitive information safe.
